Keynote Speaker - Jonathan Leggette

Jonathan(Johnny) Leggette is an enthusiastic, unapologetic, black trans intersex femme. They are an undergraduate student at the Evergreen State College, studying marine biology and anthropology. Outside of academics, Jonathan works as the peer coordinator for queer and trans students of color. Off campus, they are are a driven and innovative, intersectional, intersex activist who has traveled across the U.S. raising intersex awareness on college campuses and at conferences ranging from Creating Change in Philadelphia to Rutgers University. They work with interACT Youth to advocate for intersex youth and fight against medically unnecessary surgeries that are performed on babies and children. Jonathan makes sure to keep intersectionality and equity at the center of all of their work inside and outside of the classroom.
