Review of Agency recommendations for top 3 Legislative and Administrative priorities	<ul> <li>Jeff collected the completed templates from agencies present and members read their top 3 legislative priorities to the group. The list included:</li> <li>Access to documentation that DLR requires CPA's to have in their case files (court reports, medical info, case info, family history)</li> <li>CPA rate increase and mileage reimbursement</li> <li>Adhering to goal of permanency of dependency cases, timeliness of dependency cases</li> <li>WAC interpretation of volunteer requirements</li> <li>CPA's having greater access to information - getting access to CA's FamLink</li> <li>Background checks – using checks that schools or other agencies are using for staff and foster parents</li> <li>Extending foster care and support to 18-21 year olds</li> <li>Draft/champion a bill on qualifications that allows for people to be hired without previous experience, expand list of approved educational degrees</li> <li>Pay incentives for CA employees that are foster parents</li> <li>RAC – changing the language so that RAC's are not limited to only initial placements</li> <li>CPA referral funding process – CA improve process so there's not so much time spent chasing payments</li> <li>DLR licensing consistencies</li> </ul>
